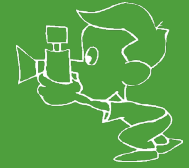


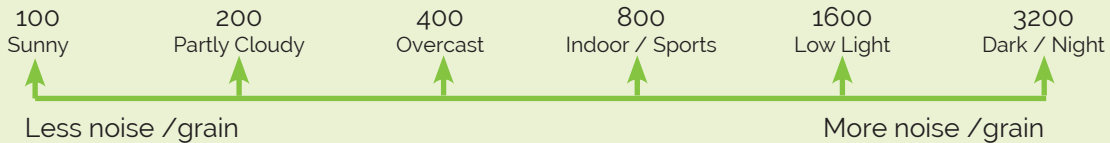
MANUAL MODE



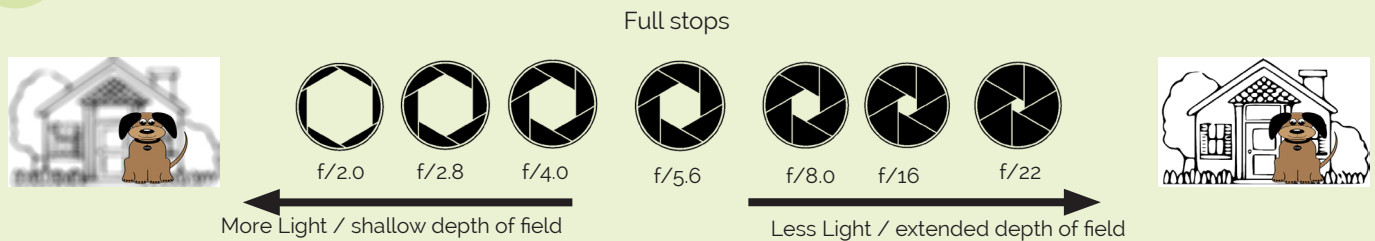
Manual mode requires the photographer to physically set 3 camera functions: ISO, f/stop and shutter speed.

1 SET THE ISO / ASA



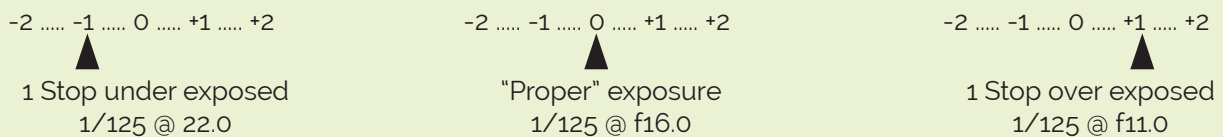
2 SET THE APERTURE / F/STOP



3 CHECK THE CAMERA METER FOR PROPER EXPOSURE



4 ADJUST THE SHUTTER SPEED OR APERTURE FOR PROPER EXPOSURE



Adjust the aperture or shutter speed for proper exposure.

Fast shutter speeds to freeze action.

Larger Aperture = More light and shallow depth of field

Small Aperture = Less Light and extended depth of field

5 FINAL CHECK : THINGS TO CONSIDER

Adjust the exposure based on subject and desired results

- Do you need to freeze the action or increase depth of field ?
- Is the image too light?
- Is the image too dark?

Remember the law of reciprocity
